



ENDOWED NAMED FUNDS

The Leonard & Ila Mitchum Cardiovascular Fund

This fund provides state-of-the-art cardiovascular equipment for Huntsville Hospital's Cardiology departments. The Mitchums gave the largest single gift ever made to the Foundation in gratitude for the care Mr. Mitchum received when he had open-heart surgery at Huntsville Hospital.

Robin Lanier Stewart Memorial Fund

This fund was established by the oncology physicians of the Huntsville Hospital Comprehensive Cancer Institute, and was later endowed by the Lanier family. The purpose of the fund is to provide financial assistance to local cancer patients who need help paying for medication costs associated with their cancer treatment.

Ruth B. Camp Scholarship Fund

The Camp Fund was established by Dr. E.E. Camp in honor of his wife, Ruth, a retired pediatric nurse. The fund provides college scholarships to students in nursing and other paramedical fields.

Ronald S. Owen Scholarship Fund

Ron Owen, a former Huntsville Hospital administrator, established this fund which provides college scholarships to deserving children of Huntsville Hospital employees.

Betty Jones Memorial Heart Fund

The Jones Fund was established in Betty's memory by her family and friends. Its purpose is to provide funding for equipment, research and training, and to support special needs of the Cardiology program at Huntsville Hospital.

Delta Zeta Endowment Fund

This fund was established by the local alumnae chapter to benefit the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit at Huntsville Hospital for Women & Children. Major funding is provided by proceeds from the annual Delta Zeta MarketPlace.

Donny Derivaux Memorial Fund

This fund was established by Donny's parents, Rebecca and Dr. Don Derivaux, to provide financial assistance to parents who struggle to be with their seriously ill children during hospitalization.



The Hill Knapp Memorial Fund for Neonatal Care

The Hill Knapp Fund was established by Hill's 2 best friends and their families, and later endowed by Hill's grandparents. Its purpose is to provide financial support to the Neonatal Intensive Care Unit where the lives of fragile infants are saved every day.

Fred Wessel Cardiac Rehabilitation Scholarship Fund

The Wessel Fund was established in memory of Mr. Wessel by his wife, Jean Wessel Templeton, and his three children. The purpose of the fund is to provide financial assistance to patients who otherwise would not be able to participate in the Cardiac Rehabilitation program at Huntsville Hospital's Wellness Center.

Mary Sylvia Whitten Memorial Fund

This fund was established to provide funds for cardiac care equipment at Huntsville Hospital. Mrs. Whitten's husband established the fund in her memory.

Otis F. & Clare H. Gay Fund for Children

Before his death, Dr. Gay, Madison County's longtime Public Health Officer, established this fund in memory of his wife, Clare. This fund benefits the nurseries and Pediatric units at Huntsville Hospital for Women & Children.

Mary Elizabeth & George Gesman Alzheimer's Symposium Fund

Mr. Gesman established this fund in memory of his wife who was a victim of Alzheimer's disease. An annual symposium provides awareness and treatment information for physicians, clinical staff and caregivers of Alzheimer's patients.

Dr. Bill V. Hewett and Bradley Hewett Memorial Scholarship Fund

Marie Hewett established this fund to provide scholarships for medical students and students pursuing nursing degrees.

Thomas and Sharon Bell Radiology Education Fund

Dr. and Mrs. Bell established this fund to provide continuing education scholarships for deserving employees in Huntsville Hospital's Imaging Department.

Sarah and Carl Gessler Cardiac Education Fund

Dr. and Mrs. Gessler established this fund to provide continuing education scholarships for Huntsville Hospital Cardiology employees who meet established criteria.

The Prasada-Rao and Bhavani Kakani Surgery Education Fund

Dr. and Mrs. Kakani established this fund to provide continuing education scholarships for Huntsville Hospital Surgery employees who meet established criteria.



The Charles Michael and Elizabeth Park Scholl Neonatal ICU Education Fund

Dr. and Mrs. Brian Scholl established this fund to provide continuing education scholarships for deserving employees in the Huntsville Hospital for Women & Children's Neonatal Intensive Care Unit; and to provide reference books, journals and other educational resources for use by the NICU staff. The endowment is named in honor of their daughter Elizabeth, and in memory of her brother Charles Michael who passed away shortly after birth.

The Dr. Jeanne Shepherd Cancer Fund

The Dr. Jeanne Shepherd Cancer Fund was established in 2001 by the physicians and staff at The Center for Cancer Care in honor of Jeanne Shepherd, a long time employee who later succumbed to cancer in 2011. The purpose of the fund is to provide cancer patients with financial assistance for housing needs, food, prescription medication, transportation, and other necessary health care expenses.

The Meena Dayal Memorial Education Fund

Dr. and Mrs. Peter Loux endowed the Dayal fund in memory of Dr. Loux's colleague, anesthesiologist Dr. Meena Dayal. The purpose of this fund is to provide college scholarships for deserving employees in Huntsville Hospital's perioperative medicine departments.

Cortner's Magic Pocket: The Crumlish-McCrary Fund Benefiting the Huntsville Hospital Health System

Cortner's fund was endowed by his grateful parents, grandparents and great-aunt and uncle, in honor of Cortner Crumlish, who was a patient in the hospital's Neonatal ICU in 2003. The purpose of this fund is to provide support for technology and programs that will enhance the delivery of health care for patients from across the Huntsville Hospital Health System service area.

The Olin B. King Memorial Scholarship Fund

The King fund was endowed by community leader Olin King's family in 2013. To extend his legacy of support for education and health care, the fund will provide scholarships to deserving Huntsville Hospital employees pursuing graduate degrees in nursing.
